ADVANCEMENTS & MILESTONES



South County Health Surgeons are breaking records with Robotic-Assisted Surgeries

On Monday, February 13, 2023, **Dr. Joseph Brady** reached a milestone after completing the 1,000th robotic surgery of his career. A general surgeon at South County Health since 2017, Dr. Brady, achieved this milestone during a routine gall bladder surgery using the assistance of the da Vinci Xi Surgical System, the most advanced, minimally invasive option for a variety of surgical treatments.

Specializing in gall bladder and hernia repair surgeries, Dr. Brady performed his first robotic surgery in 2015 and the first ever at South County Hospital in May 2018.

Dr. Bob Marchand of Ortho Rhode Island reached a global milestone on Wednesday, March 1, 2023, after becoming the first orthopedic surgeon in the world to complete their 9,000th robotic-assisted joint replacement procedure.

Since Dr. Marchand pioneered the use of Stryker's Mako SmartRobotics™ surgical technology for hip and knee replacements in 2010, the expert surgeons at Ortho Rhode Island have performed more than 17,000 robotic-assisted hip and knee replacement surgeries at South County Hospital. ▶



A Legacy of Giving

Two Individuals who will help transform the care we provide for future generations



Edith Johnston was a long-time volunteer and supporter of South County Health. Over three decades, she donated more than 25,000 hours of volunteer service. She came in on holidays, weekends and evenings when she knew she'd be the only volunteer to assist staff. As a teacher, Edith taught in Cape Elizabeth, ME, and elementary schools in Wakefield, North Kingstown, Warwick, and Westerly.

Sadly, Edith passed away in July of 2022. Her longtime commitment to our patients and staff led Edith to bequest her estate of over \$500,000 to South County Health in her will. This commitment will leave a lasting impact on South County Health for many years to come.

Marco Marinelli defines the meaning of a "grateful patient." Marco spent his professional life in the heart of Providence's Jewelry District working at his family's company, Marbro Mfg. Inc. In retirement, he became an award-winning sculptor and painter, as well as a patron of the arts.



A lifelong summer resident of South County, Marco made Narragansett his home in 1984. His first encounter with SCH came in 2007, during a bout with Lyme disease. Four years later, he found himself in the Emergency Department with an unexpected diagnosis: stage 4 cancer.

Cancer can be life-changing. For Marco, it reinforced his commitment to paying it forward and highlighted the importance of giving. Marco made a significant gift to our Cancer Center that has, and will continue to, touch the lives of countless patients facing cancer. There is an infusion bay that bears Marco's name.

Marco lost his courageous battle with cancer in 2018. His gratitude for the exceptional care he received at the South County Hospital Cancer Center motivated Marco to leave a transformative gift of over \$500,000 to South County Health after his passing. Marco's legacy of giving will be a part of the life-saving care we provide to future generations.

Investing in life-saving technology for breast health

Ann Kelley was diagnosed with invasive breast cancer in July of 2013. A long time donor along with her husband, Charles, to South County Health since 1990, Ann found the tumor herself on a routine breast exam. The 5.5 centimeter tumor did not show up on the conventional mammogram her doctor ordered two days later. It was ONLY revealed in an ultrasound. Ann later learned that she had dense breast tissue which made it more difficult to identify tumors on a regular scan. In fact, an estimated 40 percent of women have “dense” breast tissue — made up primarily of glandular and connective tissue — rather than “fatty” breast tissue. On a mammogram, dense breast tissue is white and so are tumors, making them more difficult to detect.

South County Health recognized this limitation in our equipment and responded by purchasing a 3-D tomosynthesis mammography unit in 2016. A 3-D mammogram offers significant advantages in detecting breast cancer in people with dense breast tissue because the 3-D image allows doctors to see beyond areas of density. This advanced screening tool is now available at our Medical & Wellness

Centers in East Greenwich, Warwick and Westerly, as well as on the South County Hospital campus.

Washington County has one of the highest incident rates of breast cancer in RI and compliance with annual mammograms has plummeted since the pandemic. We are aggressively responding to this drop in screenings by

creating a progressive **Breast Health Center** to bring expanded access, best of class physicians, and state-of-the-art technology to treat and prevent breast cancer.

A pioneer for the advancement of breast health, sadly, Ann lost her courageous battle with cancer in 2019. However, her legacy will live on for so many Rhode Island women whose lives will be saved because of her advocacy work.

She became an advocate who led the fight to create RI’s current law requiring all mammography providers to inform women of their breast density level as interpreted on their mammogram. Those with dense breasts are advised that they might benefit from an additional screening and to discuss options, such as an ultrasound, with their doctor. For Ann, it was a crusade to make sure other women wouldn’t be caught unaware, as she had been. ☺


▀ PARKING
