# A New Year's Eve Takes a Turn

For Russell (Russ) Flagg, New Year's Eve 2024 was meant to be a joyful time spent with family.

When a dive for a shot during a round of pickleball resulted in a hard fall, Russ brushed off the incident, determined to carry on. By the next day, however, the pain in his hip was undeniable. Unable to walk, Russ was transported by ambulance to South County Hospital.

"The pain was so intense I couldn't take a step," Russ recalled. "But the moment I arrived, South County Health's medical team went to work."

### A WORLD-CLASS TEAM IN ACTION

Russ was diagnosed with a fractured hip and required a hip replacement. Thanks to the Center for Advanced Orthopedic Surgery at South County Health and the expertise of Ortho Rhode Island's Michael Bradley, MD, MBA, and the dedicated team at South County Hospital, he was in surgery the next day.

*Reflecting on his experience, Russ shared in a heartfelt letter:*

**"FROM THE FIRST MOMENT I ARRIVED AT SCH BY AMBULANCE ON NEW YEAR'S EVE, MY CARE WAS IN THE HANDS OF THE MOST CAPABLE WOMEN AND MEN I HAVE EVER MET. YOUR MEDICAL STAFF WENT TO WORK THAT INSTANT AND MADE MY 5-DAY STAY AND RECOVERY POSSIBLE."**

Just three days after surgery, Russ returned home and was amazed by his progress. Walking, climbing stairs, and regaining his independence, he praised the exceptional care he received.

"I'm recovering at home today, and it's all thanks to Dr. Bradley, his operating staff, and the entire South County Health team," Russ wrote. "Their professionalism and compassion were extraordinary."

Russ reflected on his pickleball misstep with humor: "Next time, I'll just say, 'Good shot!'"

As a lack of access to primary care, specialty doctors, and advanced practice providers (APPs) continues to affect the Rhode Island healthcare landscape, South County Health is pleased to announce the onboarding of several new providers, including:

- ❖ **Melanie Bowdy, NP** (Primary Care) – started in December
- ❖ **Taryn Carbone, NP** (Primary Care) – starting in March
- ❖ **Erin Hogan, MD** (Primary Care) – starting in April
- ❖ **Kelly Russell, CNM** (OB-GYN Midwife) – starting in April
- ❖ **Martha Moe, MD** (AVP South County Medical Group, Medical Director of Center for Women's Health, and OB-GYN Physician) – starting in July

With the onboarding of new midwives, Deb White, CNM, who has spent over 35 years as an OB-GYN provider will be transitioning to a GYN only role in Warwick. South County Health will be accepting new annuals later this spring.

While recruitment challenges persist, particularly in the face of insufficient reimbursement rates, we understand the uncertainty these issues may bring. Rest assured, South County Health is committed to deploying all available resources to recruit top-tier providers for our primary care and specialty practices. # CANCER CENTER UPDATE

We acutely understand and have listened to the community's concerns for the Cancer Center. The health and well-being of those we care for remains our top priority. We recognize that any change in care can lead to anxiety and uncertainty, especially for our cancer patients who rely on the Cancer Center for ongoing treatment and support.

South County Health has worked diligently to ensure the uninterrupted care of all patients of the Cancer Center. We quickly brought on locum physicians, including Drs. Alarcon, Lee, and McKinney, under the leadership of Interim Medical Director Dr. Seidler. As a result of these efforts, only 40 of the more than 1,700 oncology patients have chosen to leave the Cancer Center at this time. While we regret the loss of any patient, we recognize that many of our patients continue to entrust South County Health with their ongoing care. We are proud of our commitment to providing high-quality, community-based care as evidenced by our swift action to bring on locum physicians to meet community demand.

We remain dedicated to ensuring a smooth transition and are actively working toward securing a permanent provider solution. In the interim, we are pleased to share that Drs. Alarcon and McKinney



are accepting new patients, as is Dr. Joyce, who provides radiation oncology services. We have worked carefully to manage the transition of our current Cancer Center patients to our new providers, with a focus on clear, personal and direct communication.

It is also important to address the financial sustainability of the Cancer Center, which we are committed to maintaining for the community. While staffing is a crucial part of the equation, we must also acknowledge the significant financial challenges our oncology infusion therapy program is facing. The program is currently operating at a \$3.5 million annual loss, which includes \$2 million in subsidized drugs and \$1.5 million in underwriting operational costs. To address this, we are exploring potential partnerships with like-

minded organizations who believe oncologic care is best delivered at the local, community level.

South County Health is not the only healthcare system facing significant financial challenges in cancer care. Yale New Haven Health recently announced they will no longer be providing chemotherapies, at Westerly Hospital effective March 1, 2025. Instead, their patients are being asked to commute to Waterford, CT, for their treatment where reimbursement rates are structured fairly. South County Health believes it is imperative our elected officials here in Rhode Island address reimbursement rate disparity with CT and MA expeditiously to prevent further damages to Rhode Island's healthcare delivery system.
